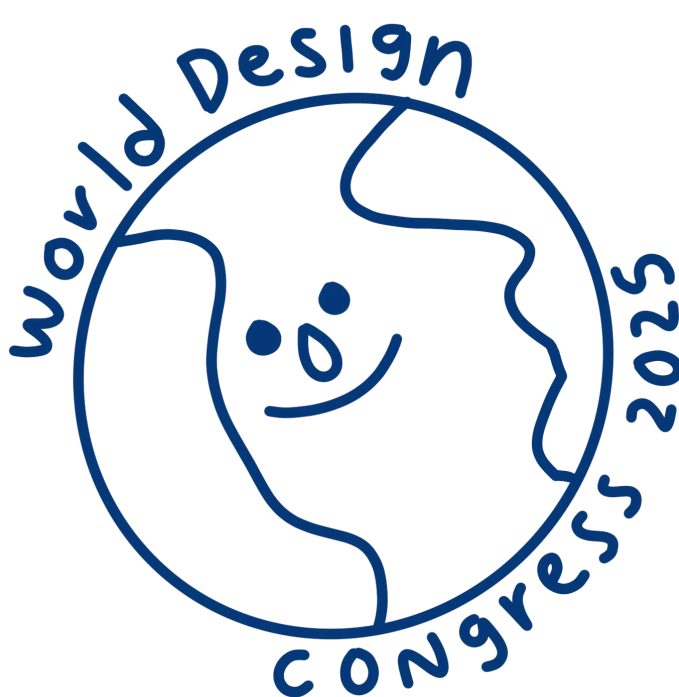

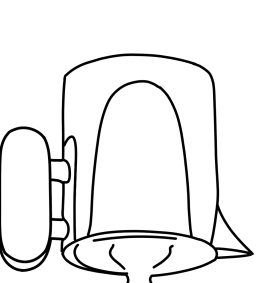

"Indie Johar from Dark Matters Lab said that we need to stop designing in the illusion of today and start designing for the for the impact on the future tomorrow."

"Priya Ahluwalia was talking about fashion futures and sustainability: how secondhand clothes that end up in southern countries is an overlooked problem. We think we're doing right by using secondhand but this issue shows there's more to it."

Justin McGuirk from Future Observatory shared that "as designers we need to start having more of a holistic view. For example, now we are in London; but we should start actually understanding other economic situations, and the climate disaster that's happening in places that doesn't directly impact us."
